\bigcirc	Sunglasses + hat
\bigcirc	Gaiters (preferably knee high)
\bigcirc	Water bottle or water bladder
\bigcirc	Toiletries
\bigcirc	One towel
	CLOTHING AND FOOTWEAR
\bigcirc	One wool/fleece beanie
\bigcirc	One pair of warm gloves
\bigcirc	Four pairs of woolen socks
\bigcirc	Four pairs of underwear
\bigcirc	One gore-tex/waterproof jacket
\bigcirc	One warm down/insulated jacket
\bigcirc	One pair of thermals (top and bottom)
\bigcirc	Two warm wool or fleece tops
\bigcirc	One pair of warm pants
\bigcirc	One pair of shorts
\bigcirc	Two lightweight/breathable tops (for warmer weather)
\bigcirc	Leather/gore-tex hunting boots (preferably mid-height for ankle support and a firm sole for grip)
\bigcirc	Minimum casual clothing and footwear for travel

	TRAVEL DOCUMENTS
\bigcirc	Passport, itinerary, airline ticket, NZeTA Visa (\$12 NZD) and IVL Visa (\$35 NZD) Apply online at www.immigrations.govt.nz/nzeta
\bigcirc	NZD cash.
\bigcirc	USD cash for tips/gratuities. We are unable to process tips through the business, so please come prepared if you plan to tip.
\bigcirc	Rifle hunters must obtain a New Zealand Firearms Permit from New Zealand Police. Please keep a hard copy and bring it with you.
\bigcirc	Driver's license if you plan to hire a car in New Zealand.
	Converter for cell phone charger, camera, laptop etc. Please keep in mind that the standard voltage in New Zealand (230 V) is higher than in the USA (120 V). You cannot use larger electronics such as hairdryers or straighteners etc. without a voltage converter.
\bigcirc	USB drive to take your photos and videos home (32GB minimum and must be compatible with Mac)

CLIMATE GUIDE

Below is a basic climate guide for the South Island of New Zealand.

- Summer (December February) The average daytime temperature is 30 10°C (86 50°F)
- Autumn/Fall (March May) The average daytime temperature is 18 6°C (65 43°F)
- Winter (June August) The average daytime temperature is 12 1°C (54 34°F)
- Spring (September November) The average daytime temperature is 17 5°C (63 41°F)

This equipment checklist is for a four-day hunt. Please ensure you pack additional underwear and socks etc. for lengthier trips. Do <u>NOT</u> overpack. If you have any questions regarding equipment or clothing, please do not hesitate to contact Mike or Maddie.
